- Utilizes historic freight rail rights of way around the center of town






## // Opportunity for Significant Impact



- Connects 45 neighborhoods
- 22% of City of Atlanta population lives in the planning area
- 19% of the City's land mass is inside the planning area
- 40% increase in Atlanta's parkland
- 6,500 acre TAD

 ABI is working in coordination with the City of Atlanta and the Atlanta Regional Commission to take the next steps in the federal transit funding process.

### Next Steps


- Initiate a Tier 2 Environmental Review of the Atlanta BeltLine
  - Tier 2 Environmental Reviews will examine the Atlanta BeltLine West and East corridors
- This is the final phase of the environmental process.
  - Phase One, the Tier 1 EIS was completed in conjunction with MARTA in August 2012.
  - Tier 1 EIS studied the 22-mile Atlanta BeltLine corridor.


- Environmental Assessment (EA) Studies
- Study Areas
  - Atlanta BeltLine West corridor -From the West End MARTA area to the Bankhead MARTA area
  - Atlanta BeltLine East corridor -From Glenwood Park area to the Piedmont Park area
  - Studies will kickoff Summer 2013 with a public community engagement process



# // ABI Update — Transit and Transportation



- Environmental Assessments
- Study Goals
  - Atlanta BeltLine West corridor-Identify which MARTA Stations to connect to at either end of the project
  - Atlanta BeltLine East corridor Identify how to cross Hulsey Yard and connect to MARTA
  - Identify and minimize potential impacts from transit construction and operations
  - Integration with proposed extensions of the Downtown Atlanta Streetcar and crosstown streetcar routes

## // ABI Update - Affordable Housing



### **Developer Incentives**

- Committed \$1.4M for 43 units of housing for seniors in Reynoldstown
- \$2.8M available for affordable housing development incentives



### Mixed Income TOD Implementation Strategy

- Enterprise Community Partners, BAHAB and Bleakly Advisory Group
- Analysis of existing housing and households
- Tools for ABI and developers to maximize impact of the Trust Fund
- Website with report and resources available in spring

### // ABI Update — Ponce de Leon Avenue Projects



• GDOT will begin resurfacing Ponce de Leon Ave from Juniper to Briarcliff this summer and will incorporate bike lanes

 ABI is working with GDOT to begin design work on the streetscape project along Ponce de Leon Ave between Boulevard Avenue and

Freedom Parkway

 ABI is finalizing our contract with the selected bidder to design on the Atlanta BeltLine corridor, between the Eastside Trail and Ponce City Market






### **Southwest Connector Trail**

- Groundbreaking took place January 12, 2013
- The PATH Foundation is opening the trail in early May (ribbon cutting date TBD).
- The trail runs along the southern boundary of Westview Cemetery from the ends of Westwood and Rogers Avenues to Lionel Hampton Trail, with a spur to Beecher Elementary on Bollingbrook Drive.









### **Edgewood Bridge Replacement Project**

- ABI is working in partnership with the City of Atlanta Department of Public Works.
- Works begins Monday, March 18.
   Demolition and reconstruction will continue through April 2014.
- Edgewood Avenue between Randolph St. and Krog St. will be closed where it crosses over the corridor.
- The detour routes are Irwin St. and DeKalb Avenue for east-west traffic.
- Open for business signs will be posted for business owners located near the construction zone.

## **Eastside Trail Construction Update**

- Improved lighting at more than 20 locations installed by Georgia Power
- Additional lighting being installed or adjusted by nearly 10 adjacent property owners
- Additional security cameras being installed this month
- Working with DPW to install new lighting under bridges (Freedom, Highland, Virginia)
- Increased APD presence





## **Eastside Trail Landscaping Plan**

- The installation of over 100,000 native grass plugs is underway on the west side of the Eastside Trail by Trees Atlanta
- Upon completion of installation, these plantings will require no irrigation and minimal care
- Volunteers needed March through May



# **Eastside Trail through Reynoldstown**

- Construction of the privately funded multi-use trail between Irwin Street and Memorial Drive will begin this summer
- Bicycle improvements will be added along Wylie Street
- Trail will including lighting and security cameras at entry points






### **Eastside Trail Gateway**

- Design is underway for the connection between Eastside Trail and Historic Fourth Ward Park
- Construction is scheduled to begin this summer for a duration of 8 to 10 months

## // ABI Update - Design



### **Allene Urban Farm**

- 3.8 acres of planting area (located on Allene Avenue)
- Farm design completed and land disturbance permit received
- Request for Proposals for grading and stormwater management planned for late March 2013

## // ABI Update - Design



### **Southwest Corridor Design**

- The Georgia Department of Transportation design process is starting for the federally-funded multi-use trail between Lena Avenue (Washington Park) and Allene Avenue
- Design and right-of-way acquisition is scheduled to take 18 months
- Construction scheduled to start in the next 3-4 years and take approximately two years for completion




