


// Where is the Atlanta BeltLine?

- Connects many of Atlanta's cultural landmarks and institutional destinations
- Connects four historic abandoned freight rail rights of way encircling the center of town






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// What is the Atlanta BeltLine?



- Unites 45 neighborhoods
- 22% of the City of Atlanta population lives in the Planning Area
- 19% of the City's land mass is inside the mile-wide 15,000 acre planning area
- 6,500 acre TAD



// ROI - Eastside Trail



- \$13 million post-purchase project cost (design + construction) with \$5 million contribution from private donors
- Over \$860 million in new private development within half a mile of this segment of the Atlanta BeltLine





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// Trails: Westside Trail



- Westside Trail construction is fully funded and underway
- 3-mile trail will connect 4 schools and 4 parks
- 14 access points
- Vertical connections
- Preparation for future transit
- Construction expected to take 2 years - 2017



// Trails: Eastside Trail Extension





- Invitation to Bid has been released
- Bids due October 13
- Contractor required to complete project in 18 months




Northern Focus Area





A-Line to North Avenue






// North Ave - Luckie Street

A-Line to North Avenue



- Based on Stakeholder and Business Community feedback, Spring Street is not a viable route connecting A-line streetcar to Baker Street
- Williams Street is also not viable due to building impacts from turning radii
- COP Drive and Baker Street remain potential connection routes



A-Line to North Avenue




- The Environmental Assessment will evaluate two potential options:




- Tech Parkway is not project ready would require new bridge, new roadway, and property acquisitions. Northside option provides better redevelopment opportunities.


