


// Where is the Atlanta BeltLine?

- Connects four historic abandoned freight rail rights of way encircling the center of town






// What is the Atlanta BeltLine?



- Unites 45 neighborhoods
- 22% of the City of Atlanta population lives in the Planning Area
- 19% of the City's land mass is inside the milewide 15,000 acre planning area
- 6,500 acre TAD






// Subareas 5, 6, 7, and 8 Boundaries






// Subarea 5 Land Use






// Subarea 6 Land Use






// Subarea 7 Land Use










- Call for monumental sculpture on Eastside Trail
- Up to \$25,000 funding available from Schrager Family Foundation
- All themes will be considered
- Site at Angier Springs access, across from the Gateway
- RFP due December 14









- Eastside Trail Extension
- Contractor negotiations are underway with work anticipated to start in late 2015/early 2016
- Construction completion 18 months after start





• Design Review Committee:

- Advocate for and support the consistent application and implementation of the BeltLine Overlay and the City zoning resolution
- Provide recommendations to the Office of Planning to support projects consistent with the Sub-Area Master Plan Visions
- Encourage enhanced design features in redevelopments and new projects
- Provide development technical assistance to elevate the "overall design quality" of each project
- Systematic tracking of all Atlanta BeltLine Projects








Ponce Streetscapes

- Construction scheduled to start in 2017







• Streetcar System Plan Refinement

 Refinement integrates multiple crosstown streetcar routes with service along the Atlanta BeltLine corridor

// Strategic Implementation Plan (SIP)



- Flexible framework to complete the short- and long-term elements of the Atlanta BeltLine
- Developed in 2013 for all projects and programs moving forward
 - Designed for completion in 2030
- Broken into 3 distinct periods
 - Period 1: FY14-FY18
 - Period 2: FY19-FY23
 - Period 3: FY24-FY30
- Outlines proposed order and spacing of projects and programs


//Strategic Implementation Plan (SIP)
