## Parks



### // High-impact greenspace.

The Atlanta BeltLine is building 1,300 acres of new parks and renovated parks – a 40% increase in the city's park land. Each new park has removed industrial contaminants from the ground and created beautiful new public spaces for the community to enjoy. The parks are made possible through partnerships and support from the public and private sectors. Several sustainable new parks are now open for the public to enjoy.

## Trails



### // Paving the way for growth.

Using a 33-mile network of multi-use trails, a new public realm is emerging that promotes walking, jogging, biking, and living along the Atlanta BeltLine. The trail system includes the core 22-mile corridor that follows the original railroad segments. With the help of the PATH Foundation, this trail system connects in-town neighborhoods and will eventually link to a broader trail network for the entire metro area.

## Transit




### // Atlanta builds forward.

Using a network of trails and light rail, the Atlanta BeltLine will link to other transit components such as MARTA and future regional rail expansions. The Atlanta BeltLine will provide critical last-mile connectivity within the City of Atlanta, an essential link for the success of all transportation plans in the region.

## Affordable Housing



### // Quality of life made easier.

The Atlanta BeltLine affordable housing program seeks to make city living financially attainable for both renters and homeowners. Our goal is to create 5,600 units of affordable housing over 25 years, with a dedicated affordable housing trust fund. To date, \$8.8 million has been capitalized in this fund, administered by Invest Atlanta. Art on the Atlanta BeltLine invites residents and visitors to explore new segments of the Atlanta BeltLine that are lined with unique temporary and permanent public art installations.
