


- U.S. Department of Justice: Community Oriented Policing Services (COPS) Hiring Program grant for \$1.875M to the City of Atlanta
 - Atlanta Police Department will add 15 additional officers to the Path Force Unit
- Atlanta Regional Commission (ARC) \$6.4M in Transportation Improvement Program Funding
 - ARC public comment opens Dec. 18 and closes Jan. 17 followed by ARC and GRTA committee and board approvals
 - Northeast Trail Design \$4M
 - Southside Trail Design \$2.4M

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Transportation Update

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


Environmental Clearance



- Defines preferred alignments for specific corridors
- Allows pursuit of federal funding
- Documents project impacts to social, natural, and built environments associated with the preferred alignment








The Project Corridor runs approximately 2 miles along Avon Avenue and University Avenue, from Murphy Avenue to Hank Aaron Drive.








Southside Trail Design




Chosewood TOD District

- Coordinated planning efforts across AHA sites, TOD Framework, and Subarea 3 Master Plan update.
- TOD Framework will update the development objectives of 2009 Master Plan & prepare framework for TOD, affordable housing, economic development, and sustainability goals.
- Framework process to conclude in January





Subarea 3 Master Plan & Self Storage



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
- Subarea 3 Master Plan Kick-off October 23rd this effort is being coordinated with the Chosewood Park Transit Oriented Development Framework.
 - Subarea Master Plans 2, 9 and 10 are proposed for 2018
- **Self-Storage Facilities Prohibition** City Council passed legislation on November 20, 2017 to prohibit new self-storage facilities within 500 feet of the BeltLine corridor



Housing Update



Inclusionary Zoning



- City Council vote November 20, 2017
- Atlanta BeltLine and Westside neighborhoods
- New rental developments with 10+ units shall include:
 - 15% units at 80% AMI OR
 - 10% units at 60% AMI OR
 - Payment of in-lieu fee, varies by subarea
- 20 years of affordability
- Incentives can include tax abatement, density bonus, parking reduction, other


