// Where is the Atlanta BeltLine?



- In the heart of the Atlanta region
- Utilizes historic freight rail rights of way around the center of town
- Revitalizes blighted industrial areas



// What is the Atlanta BeltLine?



- Connects 45 neighborhoods
- 6,500 acre redevelopment area
- 22% of City of Atlanta population lives in the Atlanta BeltLine planning area
- 8% of the City's land mass is inside the BeltLine TAD
- 40% increase in Atlanta's parkland



// Project Overview



The Atlanta Beltline is a 25 year Redevelopment Project that will:

- Improve Quality of Life by adding:
 - Parks
 - Trails
 - Transit
 - Affordable Housing
 - Public Art
 - Enhanced Mobility
 - Walkable Communities
- Revitalize Neighborhoods that have not seen investment
 - Connects 45 diverse neighborhoods
- Drive Economic Growth
 - 6,500 Acre TAD primary funding mechanism
 - Create Jobs
 - Encourage Development
- Connect Atlanta's people, places and communities





// Implementation Plan Approach Phase 4 –Transit Priorities Matrix



- ABI staff researched both local and national transportation planning documents to develop the criteria used to screen potential streetcar corridors.
 - Sources of information included other City urban circulator plans, the Connect Atlanta Plan, The ABI Redevelopment Plan, Concept 3, FTA requirements for funding urban circulator projects, and the City of Atlanta Economic Development Strategy.
- ABI staff developed the transit criteria and vetted them through public meeting in March through June 2011.
