## ABOUT THIS GUIDE

Job growth in the City of Atlanta has created new opportunities in exciting fields like hospitality, construction and technology, but many people need new training and skills to take advantage of these opportunities. This resource guide will help residents in Atlanta BeltLine communities connect with opportunities to gain new, or improve existing, skills needed to compete for these jobs.

The Atlanta BeltLine Partnership (ABP) is the private, independent non-profit created in 2005 to advance the Atlanta BeltLine vision.
